ALRB PUBLIC MEETING LEGISLATIVE REPORT

DATE: March 23, 2022

This report provides updates on legislative activity affecting the Agricultural Labor Relations Act or the Agricultural Labor Relations Board since the Board's March 9, 2022 meeting.

Senate Bill No. 1409 (Grove - R)

This bill was introduced on February 18, 2022, and referred to the Committee on Labor, Public Employment, and Retirement on March 9.

This bill proposes to repeal the Agricultural Labor Relations Act effective January 1, 2025, and directs the Board to submit a report to the Legislature by July 1, 2023, detailing a process for its abolishment. The bill further proposes to amend or replace the provisions of the Act to protect the associational rights of agricultural employees, ensure secret ballot elections are conducted for farmworkers to decide whether to have a union represent them, and to provide for the investigation, prosecution, and adjudication of unfair labor practices. Finally, the bill proposes to appropriate an amount of funds equal to the funds appropriated to the Board in 2022 for farmworker housing.

Senate Bill No. 1248 (Becker – D)

This bill was introduced on February 17, 2022. As introduced, this bill proposed nonsubstantive, technical changes to Labor Code section 1152. The bill was

amended in the Senate on March 15. As amended, the bill no longer proposes changes to the ALRA, but rather now addresses contracts for minor league baseball players. This bill will no longer appear in this report.

Assembly Bill No. 2183 (Stone - D)

This bill was introduced on February 15, 2022. As currently drafted, this bill proposes nonsubstantive, technical changes to Labor Code section 1156.
